### Side by Side Book One – Chapter 15

The words below are taken from Side by Side, Book One, Chapter 15. For each word below please write in what the word means and then a sentence using the word.

**A Cold:** a common viral infection in which the mucous membrane of the nose and throat becomes inflamed, typically causing running at the nose, sneezing, a sore throat, and other similar symptoms.

*Sentence:* Many people get a cold when the seasons change.

**Ask For Seconds:** to ask for a second helping or serving of food.

*Sentence:* Her cooking was so good everyone was asking for seconds.

**Backache:** a pain in the lower back.

*Sentence:* After she finished moving her home she had a backache for a week.

**Broken:** not working properly. separated into parts or pieces by being hit, damaged, etc.

*Sentence:* My cellphone was broken after I dropped it on the ground.

**Cheese:** a food made from the pressed curds of milk.

*Sentence:* Wallace loves to eat cheese every day.

**Cough:** to force air through your throat with a short, loud noise often because you are sick.

*Sentence:* The dust made him cough.

**Crackers:** a baked food typically made from flour. a type of biscuit, usually salted or savoury (salty or spicy).

*Sentence:* he likes to eat cheese with crackers while watching television.

**Drink: 1** to take liquid into your mouth and swallow it. **2** to drink alcohol.

*Sentence:* Can I get you something to drink?

**Earache:** an ache or pain in the ear.

*Sentence:* After the very loud rock concert she had an earache for a week.

**Eat:** to take food into your mouth and swallow.

*Sentence:* She really likes to eat at McDonalds.

**Fever:** a body temperature that is higher than normal.

*Sentence:* She needs to stay in bed as long as she continues to have a fever.

**Guest: 1** a person who is invited to visit or stay in someone's home. **2** a person who is invited to a place or an event as a special honor. **3** a customer at a hotel, restaurant, etc.

*Sentence:* We will be home this weekend entertaining guests.

**Headache: 1** an ache or pain in the head. **2** a difficult or annoying situation or problem.

*Sentence:* Writing separate essays for every university I apply to is a real headache.

**Inside:** the inner part of something such as a building or machine.

*Sentence:* The children play inside on rainy days.

**Lemonade:** a drink made usually of lemon juice, sugar, and water.

*Sentence:* I like to drink cold lemonade during the summer.

**Meal:** **1** an act or the time of eating a portion of food to satisfy appetite. **2** the portion of food eaten at a meal.

*Sentence:* We will all go out for a meal after we finish work tonight.

**Music:** **1** sounds that are sung by voices or played on musical instruments. **2** written or printed symbols showing how music should be played or sung. **3** the art or skill of creating or performing music.

*Sentence:* What kinds of music do you like the best?

**Outside:** an area around or near something such as a building.

*Sentence:* We like to play outside on nice days.

**Pie:** **1** a meat dish baked with biscuit or pastry crust (potpie). **2** a dessert consisting of a filling (as of fruit or custard) in a pastry shell or topped with pastry or both.

*Sentence:* Mom's cherry pies are very delicious.

**Prepare:** **1** to make someone or something ready for some activity, purpose, use, etc., **2** to make yourself ready for something that you will be doing, something that you expect to happen, etc. **3** to make or create something so that it is ready for use.

*Sentence:* She runs every day to prepare for the big race at the end of the year.

**Rest:** **1** to stop doing work or an activity: to spend time relaxing, sleeping, or doing nothing after you have been active or doing work. **2** something that remains over: remainder.

*Sentence:* He needed to rest after working twelve hours.

**Shout:** to say something very loudly.

*Sentence:* Someone was shouting "Fire!"

**Sore Throat:** a pain in the throat.

*Sentence:* He has been sick for a week and now has a sore throat and cannot talk.

**Spaghetti:** pasta (noodles) in the shape of long thin strings.

*Sentence:* Spaghetti with tomato sauce and grated cheese is one of my favorite meals.

**Steps:** flat surfaces, especially in a series, on which to place one's foot when moving from one level to another.

*Sentence:* The staircase has 30 steps.

**Stomachache:** a pain in or near your stomach, the organ in your body where food goes and begins to be digested after you swallow it.

*Sentence:* She had a stomachache after eating too much food.

**Toothache:** a pain in or near a tooth, one of the hard white objects inside the mouth that are used for biting and chewing.

*Sentence:* After eating candy all morning she had a toothache and had to go to the dentist.

**Weather:** the state of the air and atmosphere at a particular time and place: the temperature and other outside conditions (rain, cloudiness, etc).

*Sentence:* The weather over the coming week should be cool and cloudy.

**Yawn:** to involuntarily open one's mouth wide and inhale deeply due to tiredness or boredom.

*Sentence:* After working twenty hours she could not help but yawn.

**Yesterday:** on, during, or for the day before today.

*Sentence:* It was very warm yesterday but today is very cold.
